


MCS had over 260 volunteers this past year with a total of 10,000 hours of service.

#### **March Food Drive**

During our March Food Drive, five food donation barrels and several boxes were placed throughout Regions Hospital and Health Partner clinics around the East Side Saint Paul community. Having HealthPartners support our food drive really was a game-changer for us in the food shelf. During this annual drive, thanks to your generosity we received **28,636 pounds of food** and over **\$12,000 in contributions** from community partners, donors, and volunteers.

MCS Food Shelf Manager Joshua Bau has seen a significant increase in the number of families seeking nutritional support.

Since the beginning of this year, there has been a 20% increase in the number of people who utilize the food shelf. Food insecurity is still a prominent challenge in our East Side community. We would like to thank all those who participated in our March Food Drive. We could not help our East Side neighbors without your support.



### **Spring Clean-Up**

Merrick's Senior Spring Clean-Up was held the week of May 15th, with two groups tackling the yards of some very grateful Seniors on the East Side, Ramsey County, and Washington County. ### **Employment Services Makes Strides**

In December, Sylvia came to Merrick for some employment support. Immediately after she came to us she was diagnosed with COVID. The COVID worsened and ended up causing major health issues for her. The job she had at that time was a very active job, where she totaled upwards of 25,000 steps a day. Because of COVID, she had to be placed on leave and subsequently work restrictions. During all of this, she had to negotiate the workers' compensation process and work with the HR department to document all of her progress, doctors' appointments and treatments. Turi Svennevig-Brosi, Merrick's Manager of Employment & Career Services, stood by her side, providing support at each step. We were able to assist with some bills to carry her through this period of reduced work. Sylvia managed all of this successfully while continuing to work shorter shifts when she could - however, the physical challenges of the work were mounting. Turi continued to work with Sylvia to explore other, more suitable work opportunities. With MCS support, she landed a full-time position at the **University of St. Thomas** and increased her salary considerably. She now has a career pathway in front of her, including abundant opportunities for advanced education, taking advantage of the employee tuition programs at St. Thomas.

### **Family Services: Jaima's Story**

**Jaima** was facing eviction and possible homelessness. Merrick Case Manager, **Felicia Marsh**, began the process to help her find emergency shelter accommodations. She continued to work with Merrick to find permanent housing with additional help from Ramsey County Rapid re-housing and stabilization program. Felicia also guided Jaima in the process of applying for SNAP benefits online and she was thrilled to be accepted in the program.

While waiting for approval from Section 8, Felicia assisted Jaima with a referral to Affordable Mattress. She was able to obtain mattresses for herself and children. That allowed her to move into a 3-bedroom apartment on the East Side of Saint Paul. Jaima has remained gainfully employed full-time and is doing much better. She is amazing, motivated, and resourceful. Her hard work and initiative paid off, and she has been able to seek out additional community resources to meet her needs.

We are so proud to be providing these and many services to our participants, it is amazing to see their success! ■
